For Medi-Cal eligible children, Denti-Cal will cover preventative services (exam, topical fluoride application, and prophylaxis) once in a six month period and more frequently if there is a documented necessarily. Denti-Cal has adopted the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry's (AAPD) "Recommendations for Preventative Pediatric Oral Health Care" which indicates frequencies for diagnostic and preventative procedures:
