Losing a Critical Resource – River Street Shelter

- This is a great loss to the community and we are all upset
- Many factors led to the decision
- Guarded transparency to protect
 RSS staff
- Network Adequacy and funding mandates
- Work with Housing for Health
 Program to develop other options

SB 803 Peer Support Specialist Certification

Passed and signed into law: September 2, 2020

- Establishes a peer certification process and opportunity to support peer delivered services as a Medi-Cal reimbursable service
- Does not provide any funding to support Peer Services
- Sets a timeline of July 2022 for DHCS to establish rules and process

SB 803 Peer Support Specialist Certification

- Also requires DHCS to submit a federal waiver to support the provision of the service.
- Requires the State to fund the start-up costs of the program, once established
- Counties can opt in or opt out, and continue to provide support for Peer Support Services
- Counties participating in a pilot program are required to fully fund the costs- no federal financial participation

SB 803 Peer Support Specialist Certification

- Extensive stakeholder engagement from the State is expected
 - CBHDA
 - Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development
 - Peer Support and Family organizations
 - BH Provider organizations
 - California Behavioral Health Planning Council

Expansion of MERTY Program

- Recently awarded a second grant from CHFFA
- Will support the costs of a second MERTY Mobile Office for North County, as well as the staffing costs to expand the program (Clinician and Family Partner)

 Also received approval to utilize our existing van and staff in both South and North County during the pandemic
