Legislation

- AB 118 passed into law on October 8, 2021
- Establishes the C.R.I.S.E.S. Grant Pilot Program
 - Through the Department of Social Services (not DHCS)
 - "Community Response Initiative to Strengthen Emergency Systems Act"
 - Subject to future funding from the Legislature for implementation



Potential Grantees

- City, Counties, Tribal Departments, Disability Services, Health Services, Public Health, Behavioral Health
- Based on Grants based on criteria developed "in partnership with a stakeholder workgroup"
- Each grantee eligible for a minimum of \$250K per year under the program
- 90% of the funds would need to go to one or more qualifying communitybased organization



Goal of the Legislation

"Create and strengthen community-based alternatives to law enforcement to lessen the reliance on law enforcement agencies as first responders to crisis situations unrelated to a fire department or emergency medical service response."



Stakeholder Process

- The Department of Social Services responsible for convening a stakeholder group
- Purpose:
 - To make recommendations to the department regarding the implementation of the program as specified in legislation
- Look at the following:
 - Develop criteria for qualified grantees
 - Best practices and program recommendations
 - Consultation on implementation and priorities for technical assistance
 - Identify barriers to implementation and potential solutions
 - Recommendations on data to be collected
 - Review of data and outcomes
 - Advise on the design of the evaluation



Stakeholder Group Membership

- Emergency medical system practitioners
- Members of the public who have survived an emergency or crisis and have used community-based services
- Survivors of police brutality
- Surviving family members of someone who has been subject to use of force resulting in death or serious bodily injury by a law enforcement officer
- <u>Cannot Include</u>: current or former law enforcement officers or immediate family members of law enforcement



Legislation End Date

• All provisions of the bill are repealed as of June 30, 2026
