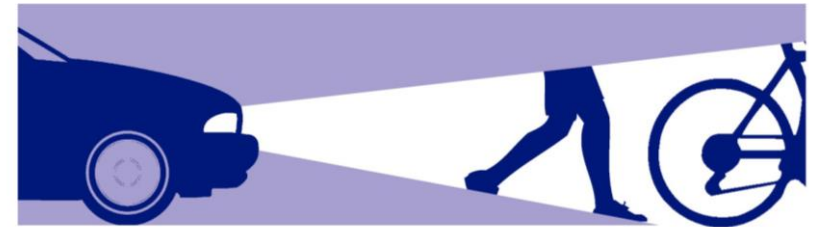

How can you make streets safer?

- Public Works projects can take long periods of time to complete
- Slowing cars down can't wait, so what is there that you can do?



Slowing Traffic: Narrow the roads naturally

1. Park your car on the street
2. Plant a tree in front of your house
3. Drive within the speed limit



Slowing traffic: Walk your neighborhood

4. Visit your neighbors regularly
5. Replace car trips with walking or bicycling trips
6. Host a block party on your street



Slowing Traffic: Create something to stop for

7. Host a yard sale to get people to stop
8. Create something of interest in your front yard



Slowing Traffic: Be a good example

9. Stop for pedestrians when you are driving
10. Indicate that there are children who may play in the area
