Why integrate?

- Collaborative care improves outcomes
- Patients more likely to go to PCP about depression, anxiety, insomnia etc. than to therapist or psychiatrist
- Patients value 'one stop shop' convenience
- Reduced stigma

- Started in 2015

- 15 licensed providers, 2 MAs
- Counseling, psychiatry
- Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)
- Whole Person Care (WPC)










Warm Handoffs Per Year



Dimitri Bacos MD, Medical Director


