# COVID-19 Case Trends - Upgrade Your Masks

COVID-19 case rates continue to increase in Santa Cruz County. Public Health's surge response will focus on supporting the healthcare system, supporting the community with COVID-19 preparedness, and maintaining Public Health operations.

The daily average number of cases is triple what we saw during the peak of last year's surge.

- Reproductive number median estimate is hovering around 1, which indicates that *transmission is slowing*.
- The 14-day change graph to the right indicates a flattening trend, with a recent spike driven by the 0-19 population.

Individual behaviors **DO** make a difference to **SLOW** the spread. What you can do during the Omicron surge:


- Get vaccinated and boosted.
- o Upgrade your masks.
- Improve ventilation and air filtration.

#### Mask Resources
