PARTNER TO INCREASE TESTING CAPACITY

Santa Cruz County, Calif. – Due to overwhelming testing demand, the County of Santa Cruz has partnered with the County Office of Education (COE) to move the south county Inspire Diagnostics testing site to the Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds, making it available to all community members.

“The COE has provided our community a great service in providing testing options for our school staff, students and their families,” said Dr. Cal Gordon, Santa Cruz County Deputy Health Officer. “We are excited to partner with the COE to expand testing to the greater community.”

The Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds testing site is located at 2601 E Lake Ave, Watsonville, CA 95076 and is open Monday-Friday, 10am to 5 pm and Saturday, 9am to 3 pm. Registration is required at <https://sccoe.link/inspiresc>.

In addition to the partnership with the COE, the County has expanded testing capacity at its three OptumServe sites. With both the COE and OptumServe expansions, testing capacity has nearly doubled during this surge.
